



The Abundant Life: The Life to Come


• John 10:10: The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.



• John 17:3: And this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.




- Genesis 2:7: then Jehovah God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living creature.


- Spirit and Soul
  - Soul is used two different ways:
    - one for life (living creature)
    - synonym for spirit (the eternal part of man)
  - Use context to determine whether speaking of us being alive or the eternal soul.
  - I will try to use the terms specifically: spirit for eternal; soul for life; body




- · Because of this some have confused, and some seek to confuse others, about the nature of man
  - Using the word soul to mean exclusively the eternal part
- Animals
  - in OT have "soul" (true, they have life)
  - But not a spirit.
  - Therefore man does not have an eternal spirit either.




- Uniqueness of man
  - made in image of God
  - separate and different than all other animals.




Psalms 139:13-14: For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. 14 I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.
Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well.




• Genesis 2:17: but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die




• Genesis 3:19 By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return.




- Death = separation
- Adam was separated from God...
  - naked, ashamed, and hid
  - cast out of Eden






• Hebrews 9:27: And just as it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment,



• Hebrews 2:15: and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery.




- Ecclesiastes 12:7: and the dust returns to the earth as it was, and the spirit returns to God who gave it.
- Genesis 3:19: till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return.




• as an example of man...




- Galatians 4:4: But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law,

    - Matthew 1:1-16:






• Matthew 27:50: And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit.




• Luke 23:46: Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!" And having said this he breathed his last.




• John 19:40: So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews.



- John 20:20: When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.




• John 20:27: Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe."


• John 21:13: Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish.




• Acts 2:31: he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption.



• Acts 1:9: And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.




- Jesus' resurrection was unique.
  - Others had been resurrected before...
  - · Lazarus was raised and was still flesh and blood
    - Still subject to death




- Jesus death dealing with sin and atonement
  - Didn't die again
    - Romans 6:9: We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.
  - Ascended to be with Father
    - Exaltation
    - Relationship



• 1 Corinthians 6:14: And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power.
