


- Judges 8





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
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Judges 9:1-2 (ESV) 1 Now Abimelech the son of Jerubbaal went to Shechem to his mother's relatives and said to them and to the whole clan of his mother's family, 2
 "Say in the ears of all the leaders of Shechem, 'Which is better for you, that all seventy of the sons of Jerubbaal rule over you, or that one rule over you?' Remember also that I am your bone and your flesh."


- Parable by Jotham, Gideon's only surviving son aside from Abimelech, to men of Shechem
- Judges 9: 7-15
- Judges 9:7: When it was told to Jotham, he went and stood on top of Mount Gerizim and cried aloud and said to them, "Listen to me, you leaders of Shechem, that God may listen to you.



- Judges 9:8-9 (ESV) 8 The trees once went out to anoint a king over them, and they said to the olive tree, Reign over us.' 9 But the olive tree said to them, 'Shall I leave my abundance, by which gods and men are honored, and go hold sway over the trees?'
- (15: trees = cedars of Lebanon: Great, big, beautiful, useful trees).



 Judges 9:10-11 (ESV) 10 And the trees said to the fig tree, 'You come and reign over us.' 11 But the fig tree said to them, 'Shall I leave my sweetness and my good fruit and go hold sway over the trees?'




• Judges 9:12-13 (ESV) 12 And the trees said to the vine, 'You come and reign over us.' 13 But the vine said to them, 'Shall I leave my wine that cheers God and men and go hold sway over the trees?'



Judges 9:14-15 (ESV) 14 Then all the trees said to the bramble, 'You come and reign over us.' 15 And the bramble said to the trees, 'If in good faith you are anointing
me king over you, then come and take refuge in my shade, but if not, let fire come out of the bramble and devour the cedars of Lebanon.'



Judges 9:16-21 (ESV) 16 "Now therefore, if you acted in good faith and integrity when you made Abimelech king, and if you have dealt well with Jerubbaal and his house and have done to him as his deeds deserved — 17 for my father fought for you and risked his life and delivered you from the hand of Midian, 18 and you have risen up against my father's house this day and have killed his sons, seventy men on one stone, and have made Abimelech, the son of his female servant, king over the leaders of Shechem, because he is your relative — 19 if you then have acted in good faith and integrity with Jerubbaal and with his house this day, then rejoice in Abimelech, and let him also rejoice in you. 20 But if not, let fire come out from Abimelech and devour the leaders of Shechem and Beth-millo; and let fire come out from the leaders of Shechem and from Beth-millo and devour Abimelech." 21 And Jotham ran away and fled and went to Beer and lived there, because of Abimelech his brother.



- 3 bad years (22) of Abimelech's rule over Israel
- Israel got what they asked for...



- Consequences: 1 Samuel 8:10-18
  - Take Sons: chariots, horsemen, run before chariots, commanders, plowers and reapers, make war equipment
  - Take daughters: perfumers, cooks, bakers
  - · Best of fields, vineyards, olives: give to servants
  - Tenth of grain, vineyards: give to officers, servants

- Best of young men & donkeys: put to work
- Tenth of flock
- You will be his slaves

Jehovah has sought out a man after his own heart 1 Samuel 13:14

 1 Samuel 13:13-14: And Samuel said to Saul, "You have done foolishly. You have not kept the command of Jehovah your God, with which he commanded you. For then Jehovah would have established your kingdom over Israel forever. But now your kingdom shall not continue. Jehovah has sought out a man after his own heart, and Jehovah has commanded him to be prince over his people, because you have not kept what Jehovah commanded you."




- Biggest question / most frequent after last lesson

  - How do we fill the hole? (Are there any real solutions?)


## the Holy Spirit has made you overseers

Acts 20:28: Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained

    - I doubt this, not how he works in at this time.



- Does the Holy Spirit just give us the Word? Act only through Word?

- What examples do we see in Scripture?




Acts 6:2-6: And the twelve summoned the full number of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables.
 Therefore, brothers, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we will appoint to this duty. But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."




• And what they said pleased the whole gathering, and **they chose** Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. These they **set before the apostles**, and they **prayed** and **laid their hands on them**.




- Group decision (whole group!)
  - Even with the Apostles present, Holy Spirit did not point to specific men.
- Character specified
- Set before apostles
- Prayed
- Laid hands



- Titus 1:5: This is why I left you in Crete,
  - so that you might put what remained into order,
  - and appoint elders in every town
  - as I directed you-



- Titus (as an <u>apostolic representative</u>, or as an evangelist?)
  - Apostolic Rep
    - "I (Paul) left you"
    - "I (Paul) directed you"
  - Where is evangelist specifically given this type authority?
- Instruction with regard to proven character of man

- Help us and Challenge us




- Like Samuel
