


Are You Merciful?



- 1 Samuel 24:4: And the men of David said to him, "Here is the day of which the Lord said to you, 'Behold, I will give your enemy into your hand, and you shall do to him as it shall seem good to you.'" Then David arose and stealthily cut off a corner of Saul's robe.

Merciful: = compassion/pity +




Merciful: = compassion/pity + help to alleviate problem

Hebrews 2:14-18: Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery. For surely it is not angels that he helps, but he helps the offspring of Abraham. Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.



Hebrews 8:12: For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more."



Jesus showed mercy to those who were suffering physically. And, more importantly, to those who suffered spiritually: teaching, salvation.

30 Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead.




31 Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side.

We don't know what he was thinking, but we know what he did. NOTHING!




32 So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side

We don't know what he was thinking, but we know what he did. NOTHING!





Luke 10.36-37: Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?"




He said, "The one who showed him mercy."

Man who owes much to master

Begs, offers to pay.

Master is merciful.




Matthew 18.21-35

Servant accosts another servant who owes him, requires payment.

Begs, offers to pay.

First servant is not merciful.



Master recalls first servant and reprimands him.

Matthew 18:33: And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?'



How do I treat those who mistreat me?

Righteous indignation? Accusation? Revile? Gossip? Silent recrimination?

When someone sins against me? Disagrees with me? Does something I don't like? Does something differently than I think they should?




Luke 6:35-36: But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil. Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful.



How do I treat those who are evil and ungrateful?

Love, Prayer, Kindness, Mercy?

Judgment, Disdain, Accusation, Gossip?




- 1 Samuel 24:10-11: Behold, this day your eyes have seen how the Lord gave you today into my hand in the cave. And some told me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, 'I will not put out my hand against my lord, for he is the Lord's anointed.' 11 See, my father, see the corner of your robe in my hand. For by the fact that I cut off the corner of your robe and did not kill you, you may know and see that there is no wrong or treason in my hands. I have not sinned against you, though you hunt my life to take it.
- 1 Samuel 24:12-13: May the Lord judge between me and you, may the Lord avenge me against you, but my hand shall not be against you. 13 As the proverb of the ancients says, 'Out of the wicked comes wickedness.' But my hand shall not be against you.



Romans 12:8: the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.


Enjoy being merciful!

Don't begrudge it; regret it; or help while disapproving.




Mark 6:34: because they were like sheep without a shepherd.

Evangelism, in part, should be motivated by mercy: compassion for those in sin and helping them to be saved by teaching them the gospel.


So many people are being mislead by false teachers: should we not be merciful to them and teach them the truth that will save their souls.




Good Samaritan: Which one proved to be His neighbor? One who showed mercy! Go, do likewise.

• Jude 1:21-23: keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life.



- 22 And have mercy on those who doubt;
  - Weak in faith (Peter on water, wind)
  - Suffering (Job)
  - Lack knowledge (Rom. 14)

waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life.

And have **mercy** on those who doubt to others show **mercy** with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh.

Jude 1:21-23

- 23 save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh.
  - Sin...
  - Tend to disappointment, smh, judgment, condemnation (depending on the gravity of the sin), even hatred
  - · Was Jesus merciful to those in sin?
    - · Yes ... Adulterous woman
    - Yes ... for me!
    - Yes ... Pharisees teaching to change their heart (hard hearts)
  - Jude writing about (18-19): scoffers, ungodly passions, cause division, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit
  - Mercy!!!



- James 2:13: For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.
  - Choose mercy
  - Jesus will be merciful to us
