



 - · Provision: Give us today our daily bread
 - Pardon: Forgive us
 - Protection: Lead us not; deliver us



- But is Jesus giving us a formula?
 - Must this be the exact words we pray?
 - Must we follow exactly this format in every prayer.?
- If so, how did Jesus pray all night?
- · Jesus' prayer in John 17 is very different in some ways
 - But not the most important way!

How does this prayer help me to pray righteously?

•

- · Avoids the fallacies of the Pharisees
 - Nothing showy, nothing to pray on street corners
- Avoids the fallacies of the Gentiles
 - No empty phrases or many words or repetition
- Strange: for many it has become exactly what Jesus warned against!

Careful... Consider David: Psalms 18:20-24

The LORD dealt with me according to my righteousness; according to the cleanness of my hands he rewarded me. 21 For I have kept the ways of the LORD, and have not wickedly departed from my God. 22 For all his rules were before me, and his statutes I did not put away from me. 23 I was blameless before him, and I kept myself from my guilt. 24 So the LORD has rewarded me according to my righteousness, according to the cleanness of my hands in his sight.



- Was David guilty of self-exaltation? Doesn't he sound like the Pharisee?
 - Psalms 18:19 (ESV) 19 He brought me out into a broad place; he rescued me, because he delighted in me.
 - Psalms 18:27 (ESV) 27 For you save a humble people, but the haughty eyes you bring down.



- · What's the difference between David and Pharisee?
 - Luke 18:9: He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt:
 - David was delivered because of his trust in God and obedience... humble (explanation?)
 - · Pharisee exalted himself before God

Our Father in Heaven

Malachi 1:6-8 (ESV) 6 "A son honors his father, and a servant his master. If then I am a father, where is my honor? And if I am a master, where is my fear? says the Lord of hosts to you, O priests, who despise my name. But you say, 'How have we despised your name?' 7 By offering polluted food upon my altar. But you say, 'How have we polluted you?' By saying that the Lord's table may be despised. 8 When you offer blind animals in sacrifice, is that not evil? And when you offer those that are lame or sick, is that not evil? Present that to your governor; will he accept you or show you favor? says the Lord of hosts.

- Honoring God is not just about the words we use at the beginning of our prayers.
- · Honoring God begins with your daily life...
 - Don't call God "Father" in your prayer if you don't honor him by how you live each day.
 - · If all you are offering to him is your blind and lame; the spare moments and the aside thoughts.
 - You are dishonoring the Father

- Hallowed be your name
 - How often, in your daily speech with others, do you use the word "hallowed"? Probably not at all.
 - · It essentially means to hold as holy.
- Leviticus 10:3 (ESV Strong's) 3 Then Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the Lord has said: 'Among those who are near me I will be sanctified, and before all the people I will be glorified.'" And Aaron held his peace.
