
- Basis of teaching is the Scriptures
 - Implies that Paul saw them as originating from God, and therefore: authoritative and true
 - Implies that Paul expected them to have a certain amount of respect for these Scriptures, because they came from God.




- Paul reasoned...
 - Studying the Bible is an active, thinking effort.
 - Our God who gave us the Scriptures expects us to think about them and use them (carefully and prayerfully).
 - They can be misunderstood and twisted.



- Explaining
 - Helping to clarify meaning and relationship between passages
- Proving
 - Providing a reasoned and reasonable demonstration of the truth
- Jesus is the Christ
 - Focused and to the point of the Scriptures:
 - salvation, forgiveness, reconciliation



- Paul didn't come to them and expect them to believe just because he told them something.
 - I am Paul! Listen to me!
 - ⁻ He did not present himself as the authority, rather he pointed to Scriptures, which pointed to God.



Paul opened the Scriptures, turned to passages that taught about the Christ, the chosen one, then showed conclusively how Jesus fulfilled those teachings and prophecies.



- It wasn't about Paul and Silas...
- It was that the truth was taught and accepted by both Jews, Greeks and Women





 - It makes my life easier, more powerful, richer





 - teaching, rebuking, correcting, training YOU?





- The Scriptures are completely different because they did not come from man, but from God himself.
- He made sure that the prophets spoke what He wanted them to say.
- Real, not imaginary or theoretical
- ⁻ Truth, Righteousness, Wrath, Grace, Love
- You can depend on it!



- Why do I need to be reminded to pay attention?

- "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased,"




- We need to be awed by the Scriptures

 - without it we know almost nothing about God.




- It is a great light!

- Psalms 36:9 (ESV) For with you is the fountain of life; in your light do we see light.


