




- Basic Foundation... repentance




- Why did the younger son want to leave his home?

 - Freedom?




- What did the younger son think of his father?

 - felt restrained?
- Was he rebellious? naive? looking to world?




- What is the path of the younger son?
 - ⁻ fun, friends, pleasure (plenty of money)




- He's really making a choice
 - he's pleasing himself, fitting in with the world
 - he's rejecting his father (although he wouldn't think of it or say it that way)
 - "I can go home whenever I like"
 - Further and further from father
 - Path is of being lost, and death
 - Closer to destruction




- Rock Bottom
 - His chosen path has shown to be an utter failure.




- Grief? Sorrow? Disappointment?
- What's next?




- 2 Corinthians 7:10 (ESV) 10 For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without **regret**, whereas worldly grief produces death.
- Trench: When there was a difference made, metanoia was the better word, which does not properly signify the sorrow for having done amiss, but something that is nobler than it, but brought in at the gate of sorrow.




- Grow hard hearted

- Keep on thinking poorly of father




- How does he continue to think of his father?

 - Refusal to go home?








- Repentance

 - Trench: a thorough change of the heart and soul, of the life and actions




- Thayer: a change of mind
- (Vine's Complete Expository Dictionary) this change of mind involves both a turning from sin and a turning to God.
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2 Corinthians 7:8-13 (ESV Strong's) 8 For even if I made you grieve with my letter, I do not regret it—though I did regret it, for I see that that letter grieved you, though only for a while. 9 As it is, I rejoice, not because you were grieved, but because you were grieved into repenting. For you felt a godly grief, so that you suffered no loss through us. 10 For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death. 11 For see what earnestness this godly grief has produced in you, but also what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what fear, what longing, what zeal, what punishment! At every point you have proved yourselves innocent in the matter. 12 So although I wrote to you, it was not for the sake of the one who did the wrong, nor for the sake of the one who suffered the wrong, but in order that your earnestness for us might be revealed to you in the sight of God. 13 Therefore we are comforted.






- salvation (without regret)






- earnestness (diligence, haste, zealous effort)
 - eagerness to clear yourselves
 - indignation
 - fear
 - longing
 - zeal
 - punishment




- earnestness for us (12)
 - worldly grief greater separation from father
 - godly grief brings closer to father
 - Repentance is not just about sorrow, or changing my self and my ways
 - Repentance is about RECONCILIATION!




- He doesn't just change his mind about his actions, though that is obviously a part of repentance
- He primarily changes his mind about his father!
 - He wants to reconcile with his father.
 - He wants to go home!




- We are told how he now thinks of his father.


- Generous to All (even servants)
 - more than enough bread
- Welcoming, trustworthy
 - arise
 - go to my father
 - sinned before heaven
 - sinned before you
- Honorable
 - not worthy to be son
 - treat as hired servant




- Luke 15:20-21 (ESV) 20 And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. 21 And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'




Luke 15:22-24 (ESV) 22 But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. 23 And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. 24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate.




Corinthians 5:18-21 (ESV) 18 All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.


- 28 But he was angry and refused to go in.

 - Think about it....




- 28 His father came out and entreated him




- Who is the older brother angry with? His brother? or His father?

 - YOU kill fatten calf for him.




- Older son didn't have right attitude about father even though he was "obeying" him.
- He was out in the field working, but
 - SERVED
 - Never disobeyed
 - I get nothing! No blessing.



- How is the older son thinking of his father?
 - Father is a demanding man, forces labor
 - Father is not generous
 - Father is unfair
