
(Lenski's Commentary on the New Testament) "Nor the power of God" have they known, i.e., from the Scriptures. This is not God's power to raise the dead but his power in regard to the dead bodies as he raises them, as though the only possible way in which he could raise them would be to make them exactly as they were in this earthly life. What a pitiful conception the Sadducees had of the power of God in the world to come! That conception was the product of their blindness not of the revelation God had placed into their hands. But that is the way in which many make use of the Scriptures to this day, and they do so especially in regard to the revelation concerning the resurrection of the dead. Jesus declares that the Old Testament reveals the resurrection, even the power of God in the way in which he will raise the dead; but many modern theologians deny what Jesus asserts regarding the Old Testament.








Resurrection -> Reign






Resurrection -> Hope






Resurrection —> Purity









- Grow in Him.






Resurrection —> Dedication and Work






