



Go on to Holiness






We Are Holy!






- Romans 11:16 (ESV) 16 If the dough offered as firstfruits is holy, so is the whole lump, and if the root is holy, so are the branches.


Another way of looking at God's holiness.




When we sin, we separate ourselves from God.




- John 3:16 (ESV) "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

- Holy love that makes a way for us that we cannot do for ourselves.






Baptism




Romans 6:19-23 (ESV) so now present your members as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification. 20 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. 21 But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. 22 But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. 23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.




- Which of these is correct?
 - Both in certain ways and situations!




- If we see His holiness exclusively this way...
- Jehovah is holy and wrath is a result of our sin.
 - When we get bad enough, He does turn away.
 - Generally any sin...



- Like the Pharisees did... turned it into a reason to condemn others, separate from them.
- Pharisees put the emphasis on this aspect of holiness also (Separated Ones)
- God is holy.
- We are to be holy as He is holy.
 - Therefore we must separate ourselves from others who are not as holy?
 - Emphasizes exclusiveness.



- But we must also remember the preeminence of His love.
 - Holiness that doesn't want us to be separate from Him in spite of what we've done.
 - Holiness that provides brings us back together



- Our holiness needs to be like God's holiness.
 - But we don't have the right to judge, or vengeance.
 - Includes the sacrifices necessary to help others be like us.
 - Holiness that is striving for inclusiveness not exclusiveness
