

- · Scripture Reading Psalm 106



PSALM 106:32-33


- Psalms 106:32-33 (ESV) 32 They angered him at the waters of Meribah, and it went ill with Moses on their account, 33 for they made his spirit bitter, (Or they rebelled against God's Spirit) and he spoke rashly with his lips.
- · NASB: Because they were rebellious against His Spirit, He spoke rashly with his lips.
- · NETFull: for they aroused his temper, and he spoke rashly.
 - (NET Bible Notes Full Notes) 106:33 a tn The Hebrew text vocalizes the form as מָרָה (himru), a Hiphil from מְרָה (marah, "to behave rebelliously"), but the verb fits better with the object ("his spirit") if it is revocalized as מָרַר (hemeru), a Hiphil from מְרַר (marar, "to be bitter"). The Israelites "embittered" Moses' "spirit" in the sense that they aroused his temper with their complaints.

- We can quench the spirit in our brothers.
- · We can quench the spirit in our leaders.
 - · They may recover in some ways, and continue to lead.
 - · But the consequences can be devastating to them and to us.
 - · This is why some men hesitate or refuse to be elders.
 - · We make the job hard!

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I QUENCH THE SPIRIT IN MY BRETHREN?

- What happens when I quench the Spirit in my brethren?
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Two examples demonstrate that my actions affect my brethren.
 - · 10 spies melted the hearts of the people from entering promised land
 - · 3 tribes discouraged the rest of Israel in entering promised land
 - · What I do, or don't do, can affect this congregation either positively or negatively.



Discouragement is evil and can destroy the people

HOW DO I QUENCH THE SPIRIT IN MY BRETHREN?

- · How do I quench the Spirit in my brethren?
 - Four factors



- Unbelief when we should be trusting
 - · God was giving Israel the land
 - · Spies: not able, bad report
 - · People: wept, grumbled
 - · Numbers 14:3: Why is Jehovah bringing us into this land to fall by the sword? Would it not be better for us to go back to Egypt?



- Hebrews 3:12-19 (ESV) 12 Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God.
- How had they fallen away from God?
 - · Jehovah brought us here to die.
 - · (Not denial of God's existence)
 - · Impugning God's motive and ability.
 - · Failing to see the promises and purposes of Jehovah as real.



- · Unbelief looks different than we might expect.
- Not an outright denial of His existence... atheism
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Rather a refusal to embrace Him and his promises when faced with trials.




- 13 But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. 14 For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end.
- · Original confidence
- · deceitfulness of sin
- hardened



- 15 As it is said, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion." 16 For who were those who heard and yet rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt led by Moses?
- Hard hearts
- · Rebellion




• 17 And with whom was he provoked for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? 18 And to whom did he swear that they would not enter his rest, but to those who were disobedient? 19 So we see that they were unable to enter because of unbelief.



· Numbers 20:12 (ESV) And the Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "Because **you did not believe in me**, to uphold me as holy in the eyes of the people of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land that I have given them."



· Psalms 106:24 (ESV) Then they despised the pleasant land, having no faith in his promise.




• Hebrews 4:2 (ESV) For good news came to us just as to them, but the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened.



- Psalms 95: 10 For forty years I loathed that generation and said, "They are a people who go astray in their heart, and they have not known my ways." 11 Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."
- · ways not knowledge of law
- · ways how Jehovah works for them.



• 7 For he is **our God**, and we are *the people of his pasture*, and *the sheep of his hand*. Today, if you hear his voice, 8 do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness, 9 when your fathers put me to the test and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work.



• 10 For forty years I loathed that generation and said, "They are a people who go astray in their heart, and they have not known my ways." 11 Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."

- Do I really believe in God or am I trapped in unbelief?
- Do I really trust in Him to keep his promises and fulfill his purpose?
- · Have I seen His ways? How do I really think about Him?
 - · Often seen in how we try to teach gospel. Entertainment, food, church
- · Am I hardened by the deceitfulness of sin?
- · Disobedience and Rebellion



- Know Him... read bible
- · Hold fast to original confidence.
- · Sing and worship



Trust Him in all things at all times.
