






2 Corinthians 3:18






- How would you describe the glory of Jesus? When do you see it?
- Birth: angels, star




- Baptism of Jesus:

 - This is the Lamb of God




- Miracles

 - Dead raised




- Transfiguration




- Vital that we see the glory of Jesus in these things

 - How can we be like Him?





- Rebukes Jesus



This shall never happen to you." 23 But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me. **For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man.**"






- Can we be like Him?
- How can we be like Him?






- 7 but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.






- Hebrews 2:14-18 (ESV) 14 Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise **partook** of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, 15 and **deliver** all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong **slavery**. 16 For surely it is not angels that he helps, but **he helps the offspring of Abraham**. 17 Therefore he had to be **made like his brothers in every respect**, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to **make propitiation for the sins** of the people. 18 For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.





 - love and serve



- Matthew 22:35-40 (ESV) 35 And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. 36 “Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?” 37 And he said to him, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. 38 This is the great and first commandment. 39 And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. 40 On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.”



Matthew 22:35-40

- To be transformed we must love God with all our heart, soul, and mind
 - He wants all of me, not just some parts, some times
 - Love of God must be greater than the love of any other person (can we do this?)
 - We must love to live as taught by God more than we love living to please ourselves or others.
 - God's thinking must be our way of thinking, as much as possible.
 - Otherwise, we do not love God with all our heart.

Matthew 22:35-40

- Our actions will demonstrate our love for God and all others.
 - We live as Jesus lived.... a servant:
 - nature of a servant
 - not just conforming outwardly
 - Obedient to God
 - Compassionate to others, merciful.
 - We refuse to live in ways that Jesus said were evil, worldly, darkness
 - We must become like Jesus



- Matthew 14:14: When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them and healed their sick.
- Mark 6:34: When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. And he began to teach them many things.



- Were all these people genuinely seeking Jesus, truth, salvation?
 - Some greedy? opportunistic? show? selfish?
 - some healing
 - some food
 - Yet Compassion!
- Adulterous woman, woman at well?
- Hypocrites? Those who tested him?
- He knows us in all our ugliness and sinfulness.
- Love them all and died for them!



- What is the measure of our being like Jesus?
 - Is it being obedient to following the exact pattern and details?
 - Is it in loving as Jesus loves?
 - Did not Jesus do both?



- Will we sacrifice ourselves for the salvation of others?
 - Go to the cross?
 - Suffer without complaint?
 - Forgive those who harm us and murder us?
 - Care about those who we don't know?



- Do you love Jesus?
 - Most will readily say “Yes!”
- How much?
 - Will all your heart, mind, soul?
 - Does your life reflect this love?
- What are you doing? How are you serving?
 - Have you stopped?
 - Are you pressing on?




