

Great ... Is the Mystery of Godliness


- · 1 Timothy 3:16
- · Sometimes the simplest telling of a story is powerful in reminding us about something we all know, but need to join together in common so that we are united in our foundational understandings.



- · For me, this song is clearly about Jesus, and our salvation
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ It's a reminder of the grace of Jesus
 - · It's a refreshing way to see the gospel
- · Romans 1:16: For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.



- 1 Timothy 3:9 (ESV) 9 They must hold the **mystery of the faith** with a clear conscience.
- $\cdot\,$ 1 Timothy 3:16: Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of godliness:
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ To me, this expression is a reference to what we commonly call "the gospel": the good news.
- · Used here of something that was hidden, but is now revealed (made clear, made known)



- Great
 - · ... not that it's a great unknown,
 - · Rather it is Amazing, Majestic, Worthy of praise
- · We Confess
 - · The heart of this song.
 - · By singing this song we are boldly declaring just how amazing the gospel is
- · All centers around Jesus


 $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ The second couplet looks at the spread of the gospel




- Vindicated by the Spirit: Messiah, fulfilling prophecies
- · John 1:32-34 (ESV) 32 And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. 33 I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' 34 And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."


- · Vindicated by the Spirit: Messiah, fulfilling prophecies
- Luke 4:16-21 (ESV) 16 And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read. 17 And the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written, 18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, 19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." 20 And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. 21 And he began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."




- Incarnation
 - · He was manifested in the flesh

- · This is amazing love:
 - · God becomes a man, joins us as humans to destroy death, deliver us, save us, and help us.
 - · This is the faithfulness of God that he has kept his promises from Abraham and all the prophets.




- Proclamation

- · Seen by angels
 - · Angels did witness the life of Jesus: deeply involved from what we see
 - · Birth: Joseph, Mary, Shepherds
 - · Flight to Egypt
 - · Return to Nazareth
 - · After temptation
 - · Garden of Gethsemene
 - Resurrection
 - Ascension
 - · Day of judgment



- 1 Peter 1:12 (ESV) 12 It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in the things that have now been announced to you through those who preached the good news to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven, things into which angels long to look.
- · The angels would be a further confirmation of Jesus' work and the gospel.



- · Seen by messengers: reliable witnesses of the events involving
- 1 Peter 1:12 (ESV) 12 It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in the things that have now been announced to you through those who preached the good news to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven, things into which angels long to look.

Proclamation | seen by messengers, | proclaimed among the nations, | things that have now been announced to you through those who preached the good news to you | 1 Peter 1:12


- · "angel" may also be translated "messengers" (often is, depends on context)
 - (Theological Dictionary of the New Testament (Abridged Little Kittel)) 1. The meaning 'human messenger' has only a small role in the NT, being applied to the scouts sent by Joshua (Jms. 2:25), the men sent to Jesus by John (Lk. 7:24), those sent ahead by Jesus (Lk. 9:52), and the Baptist as the messenger of the covenant sent by God (Mt. 11:10 and par.).
 - · Mt. 11:10; Mk. 1:2; Lk.. 7:27: John the Baptizer
 - · Lk. 7:24: John's messengers to Jesus
 - · Lk. 9:52: Jesus' messengers (disciples) through Samaria




- · The role of the apostles was to be eyewitnesses of Jesus' life, death, resurrection and ascension
 - · Acts 1:21-22 (ESV) 21 So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, 22 beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection."
 - · Acts 2:32 This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses.
- · The apostles as eyewitnesses of Jesus' life are motivated to tell others of this good news (gospel).

Proclamation | seen by messengers, proclaimed among the nations, | Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation. | Mark 16:15


- Proclaimed among the nations
 - \cdot Mark 16:15 And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.
 - Romans 1:1-6



• Romans 1:1-6 (ESV) 1 Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, 2 which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, 3 concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh 4 and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, 5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, 6 including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,



- Proclamation
 - · seen by angels

- · Our Father has sent a message out to everyone.
 - · It is trustworthy (angels or messengers)
 - · It is proclaimed so that all can hear this good news
- \cdot Romans 10:17 So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

J believed on in the world, taken up in glory.

I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day.

- · Believed on in the World
- · 2 Timothy 1:8-12 (ESV)
 - · 8 Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner,
 - · but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God,
 - · 9 who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works
 - · but because of his own purpose and grace,

I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day.



 - 11 for which I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, 12 which is why I suffer as I do.



- · Colossians 3:4 (ESV) 4 When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

- · Confess it
 - Tell others.
 - Live it.
