


Anticipating the Messiah


- · Anticipating the Messiah
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Around the time of Jesus' birth, there was some anticipation that the Messiah would soon come.

Simeon * waiting for the consolation of Israel * not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ * my eyes have seen Your salvation


- Simeon
- · Luke 2:25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him.
- · Luke 2:26 And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ.
- · Luke 2:30 for my eyes have seen your salvation



- · Luke 2:38 And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ At the time of Jesus \dots Israel was anticipating the coming of the Messiah
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ But there was also a problem.



- · They tended to focus on him as a king, like David
 - · 2 Samuel 7:16 And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever."




- · But the prophecies give us another picture of the Messiah also
 - · Isaiah 52:14 As many were astonished at you— his appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the children of mankind—
 - · Isaiah 53:2-3 he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. 3 He was despised and rejected by men,




· There Was No Place


• Galatians 4:4-7 (ESV) 4 But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. 6 And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" 7 So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God




- · Luke 2:7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.
- · Inn is more likely a guest room (Lk. 22.11, upper room) (not a Motel 6)
- \cdot Most likely they were seeking room at the home of family or friends, but the census had brought so many people in.
- · This wasn't a malicious rejection.
- · Nor a business decision.
- But if they had known this was the Messiah being born ... would they have made room?




- · John 5:39-40 (ESV) 39 You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me, 40 yet you refuse to come to me that you may have life.
- 2 Peter 1:19 And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts,




- · Luke 4:16-30

 - · 22 And all spoke well of him and marveled at the gracious words that were coming from his mouth.




- · And they said, "Is not this Joseph's son?"

- · 28 When they heard these things, all in the synagogue were filled with wrath.
 - 29 And they rose up and drove him out of the town and brought him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they could throw him down the cliff.
 - · 30 But passing through their midst, he went away.






· John 1

The true light ... was coming into the world John 1.9


- · John 1:9-14:
 - 9 The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.




- 10 He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him.

· 11 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him.






· 14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.





 - · Don't reject, don't delay.


