


 - · Stumble, Destroy

 - · Despise, humiliate
 - · Wait for one another
- · Spiritual Gifts: For the common good to build up
 - · Childish thinking verses Mature thinking







- · 1 Corinthians 12:31 But earnestly desire the higher gifts.
 - · And I will show you a still more excellent way.



- · And I will show you a still more excellent way.
- \cdot to throw beyond, surpass (CWSB Dictionary)
 - · With the meaning of par excellence (1 Cor. 12:31, meaning a far better way)
- · a throwing beyond, an overshooting; extraordinary amount or character, transcendency
 - · (Mounce's Complete Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words) [5651] ὑπερβολή hyperbolē 8x pr.
- This verb, having an original sense of 'to throw beyond,' means 'to go beyond,' 'to stand out,' 'to excel,' or, censoriously, 'to transgress the proper measure.' The noun means 'excess' or 'supreme stage or measure.'
 - · (Theological Dictionary of the New Testament (Abridged Little Kittel))







- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ When Paul uses language like this, what is he appealing to in the Corinthians?




- · When Paul uses language like this, what is he appealing to in the Corinthians?
 - 1 Corinthians 3:1-4 (ESV) 1 But I, brothers, could not address you as spiritual people, but as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. 2 I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it. And even now you are not yet ready, 3 for you are still of the flesh. For while there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not of the flesh and behaving only in a human way? 4 For when one says, "I follow Paul," and another, "I follow Apollos," are you not being merely human?




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
- \cdot Paul is appealing to the Corinthians on their current level of understanding...
 - · If what they are concerned about is being important
 - · And doing something great
 - · And comparing themselves
- · Then he's going to teach to the limitations of their thinking
 - · not being spiritual, but fleshly and human
- \cdot So Paul is appealing to them to seek something that is just the very best.
 - Incomparable




- 1 Corinthians 14:1 Pursue love, and earnestly desire the spiritual gifts, especially that you may prophesy.
- · Pursue love
 - · If you're going to go after anything ... chase love.
- · To follow or press hard after, to pursue with earnestness and diligence in order to obtain, to go after with the desire of obtaining (CWSB Dictionary)




- · Why is love the more excellent and greatest?
- · Why should I pursue love?
 - · Paul is going to give us 4 reasons why we should pursue love




• 1. Love provides meaning.




• 1 Corinthians 13:1-3 (ESV) 1 If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.




- 1 If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.
- \cdot Paul is not diminishing speaking in tongues. If that's the gift given to you by God \dots great. Use it.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ But if you do use it and you don't have love for your siblings.
- · It's all just noise
 - · you are all show and completely useless.
 - · (So stop it!) ???




- · 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Here's more examples of the gifts ... but now to the extreme.
 - · I'm the best ... all mysteries, all knowledge
 - · faith to move mountains
 - · Again that's great use your gifts ... that's why you have them.




- But Paul is not just looking at the gifts, he's refocusing on how I see myself because I have THIS gift ... and I have it like NOBODY else.
 - · (I'm so very special!)
- But if you do use it and you don't have love for your siblings.
- · Then you are nothing
 - · (Ouch, too personal?)
 - · The gift is not given to make you think that you are great.




- · 3 If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.
- \cdot Paul moves away from spiritual gifts to things any of us can do ... and again, notice that he goes to the extreme.
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ The things we'd really pat ourselves on the back for.
 - · Extreme sacrifice
 - · And there may be times when these would be necessary?
 - · But it also feels so hypothetical.



- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ But even if you give up everything, but if you do it without love for your siblings \dots
 - · Ananias and Sapphira tried this ... or tried to make it look good
- · It will do you no good.
 - · You don't automatically gain God's praise or approval.
 - · You don't automatically gain heaven.
 - · It doesn't make you better than anyone else at all.




- · Whatever you think of yourself, whatever you think you can do
- · If you don't have love
- · It has no meaning.



- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ But if you have love ... then it's meaningful.
- · So pursue love.


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- · 2. Love is altruistic.
 - · Altruistic is focused on what I can do for others for their benefit.
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ It is not a diminishing of myself.
 - It is not thinking of myself as unimportant, unworthy.



- · 1 Corinthians 13:4-6 (ESV) 4 Love is
 - · Three positives: patient, kind, rejoices with the truth.




- · 1 Corinthians 13:4-6 (ESV) 4 Love is
 - · 8 Negatives
 - · does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing
- · This is a lot to overcome sometimes.
 - · Notice that he's really focusing on what hinders ME from loving YOU.
 - · These are 'me' issues.



- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Paul is reminding us that our goal is not to make ourselves greater
 - \cdot But to help our brothers ... especially when they are struggling and difficult to deal with
 - $\,\cdot\,$ And realizing that ... um ... they are not the problem I AM
 - · We want to build them up in Christ, help them get to heaven.
 - · Doesn't condone sin or unrighteousness or wrongdoing: that's not love or helpful.
- · So what can I do to help you?
 - · And this is better than aggrandizing myself
 - · And this is better than me sinning against you even if you don't know it.
- · So Pursue Love.




- · 3. Love is strong.
- · 1 Corinthians 13:7 (ESV) 7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.



Bears

- · (I) Generally meaning to conceal, with the acc. (1 Cor. 13:7, love hides the faults of others or covers them up). (CWSB Dictionary)
- The meaning, then, is perhaps that love 'covers' all things. In full self-giving to others, the love that is rooted in God's love **keeps silent about unfavorable** matters.
 - · (Theological Dictionary of the New Testament (Abridged Little Kittel))
- properly denotes "to protect by covering"; then, "to conceal";
 - · (Vine's Complete Expository Dictionary)




- · Proverbs 10:12 (ESV) 12 Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all offenses.
- · Proverbs 17:9 (ESV) 9 Whoever covers an offense seeks love, but he who repeats a matter separates close friends.
- \cdot 1 Peter 4:8 Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins.
 - · The picture here is of us helping our siblings when they are burdened.



· Believes

- · This does not mean that we are gullible.
- · I think the focus on this is having confidence (faith, trust) in our siblings.
- · Choosing to think the best of their motives, actions
- · Or even giving them credence when they are struggling, suffering, coping with sin



· Hopes

- · Thayer: "hopefully trust in"
- · Good expectations
- · Expecting the best of my siblings, especially instead of expecting the worst, or less than



Endures

- · suffer patiently
- · When my siblings are being difficult ... I choose to be patient
 - · No lashing out against them
 - · No giving up on them



- · 3. Love is strong.
 - \cdot Strong in the sense that when my sibling is weak for whatever reason I step up to help their weakness.
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ I do this with a smile, not a sigh.
- · Pursue this love.




- 4. Love never ends. 13:8-12
 - · 8 Love never ends.
 - · As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away.
 - 9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part, 10 but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away.
 - 11 When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child.
 - · When I became a man, I gave up childish ways.
 - 12 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face.
 - · Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known.




- · 8 Love never ends.
 - · As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away.
 - \cdot 9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part, 10 but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away.
- \cdot The Corinthians loved the gifts ... but they are temporary
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ There's something that is much more, enduring
 - · Love never ends: It's better




- 11 When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child.
 - · When I became a man, I gave up childish ways.
- · This seems very pointed to the immaturity of the Corinthians.
 - · They were so self focused that they hurt their siblings
 - · They needed to give up this immaturity and choose something that's not as flashy and showy.
- · Love for my siblings is maturity.



- 12 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face.
 - · Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known.
- · The Corinthians loved knowledge
 - · but Paul reminds them that what we know now is nothing compared to what we will know
 - · there's so much more
 - · Knowledge puffs up, love builds up.
- · What's better: Love!
 - · Consider how in Jesus love has been demonstrated to it's fulness.
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ His love that gives us rich mercy and grace and kindness



- · Love never ends.
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ We can pursue a lot of things \dots but so many of them are temporary and ephemeral.
 - · Pursue Love!

- · How can I pursue love?
- 1 Corinthians 16:14 Let all that you do be done in love.
 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ When I have a grievance with my brother?
 - $\cdot\,\,$ With Love, take the wrong and be defrauded
 - · When I want to eat meat that makes my sister stumble?
 - · With Love, don't eat it, build her up



- · When we come together to eat the supper
 - · with Love, make it better for everyone and wait for one another
- · When we come together and use our gifts
 - · with love, use your gift to build others up
 - · even if that means not using your gift so that someone else can use theirs.




- · Love is the more excellent way, and is the greatest.
 - · A more excellent way to what?
 - · Context: for us to build each other up.
 - · Since love is the best, we shouldn't expect it to be easy.
 - · Love is hard.
 - · Jesus sending his son for our forgiveness and reconciliation.
 - · Love is hard but it is the best way.
- · So Pursue Love.
