




- Sojourners and Exiles
 - 12: they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.
 - Abstain from Passions of the Flesh
 - Honorable Conduct
 - Doing Good
 - Live as Free People
 - Endure Suffering
- Be SUBJECT
 - 13: Every human institution
 - · 18: Servants, subject to Masters with all respect
- Why is being in subjection so important to those who have been chosen by God?



- Peter addresses 5 areas of our relationships.
 - We've mentioned two already.




- Subject to every human institution
 - Saints have often lived under human governments that are opposed to us in various ways.
 - · Peter doesn't discuss how well the governments are or are not doing their appointed purpose
 - (from God)
 - Subject to the government
 - But living as free people
 - Living as servants of God
 - $\cdot\,$ We are not merely subject to the government, but to God
 - Honoring everyone, loving brotherhood, fear God, and honor emperor.




· Servants subject to Masters

• With respect: both good, gentle also unjust




- · Wives subject to OWN husbands
- · Often these verses are addressed with little to no reference to the context.
 - But the instruction follows closely with what Peter is teaching.
 - He's teaching us to live in a way that demonstrates that those who follow Jesus do good and have a glorious God and hope of salvation




• This means that Peter is not just teaching us about our marriages, but about how our marriages are intended to show others that we are disciples of Jesus.


- \cdot When he speaks of masters: some are unjust and the result is suffering despite doing good
- Jesus suffered unjustly by those who governed him (Roman and Jewish), and his own people.
- · Now husbands who are not elect exiles (do not obey the word)
 - This doesn't mean that they are bad men




- · Why is especially important for wives of nonbelievers to be subject to their husband?
 - · Husbands and wives see each other at their best and at their worst.
 - Peter's point is that by acting this way a wife can save the soul of her husband!
 - This is a beautiful thought, and really important for marriage.
 - We can help each other get to heaven.




- But we also have a picture of what it means to be subject.
 - It's not craven.
 - Peter uses these words to help us understand being subject
 - respectful conduct
 - pure conduct
 - $\cdot\,$ adorning of the heart: gentle and quiet spirit
 - · do good
 - · do not fear




- Sarah called Abraham "Lord"
 - That doesn't mean that she capitulated to absolutely everything Abraham said.
 - Infamously, She convinced Abraham to throw out Hagar and Ishmael.
 - Which doesn't sound like she "obeyed" nor had a gentle and quiet spirit
 - But our concepts of the roles of husbands and wives is influenced not just by God's word, but by our culture and the household we grew up in.
 - · So ... caution to be subject doesn't mean that we just "do what we're told"
 - Like Joseph in the service of Potiphar, he fled when needed.




- · Subject to one's husband so save his soul
 - Not by constantly preaching
 - But by making sure our conduct shows that we hope in God.




- The last two examples don't specify "be subject" But they do say: "likewise" and "finally": context indicates that we include this instruction
- The behavior of a husband to his wife is also seen by the world: does it indicate that we are disciples of Jesus
 - Again, the standard is not what society or culture defines as the role of the husband.
 - And just like the wife, the husband must be striving to help his wife to be a godly woman, who is saved.



- Understanding way
 - Understanding often has to do with knowledge, knowledge of God's word and how we should walk.
 - · A husband should treat his wife not based on what he's seen in the world
 - · Rather based on what God teaches us about how we are to love one another, showing kindness, mercy, compassion




- Honoring
 - Weaker vessel: not about strength, emotion
 - Peter is not talking about gender differences
 - An idiom
 - worthy of higher honor and care; to treat delicately (not common)




· How does this instruction help us understand the importance of how our behavior as sojourners and exiles?

- Ephesians 5:21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.
 - Ephesians 5:25 (ESV) 25 Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her
 - he might sanctify her (26)
 - present the church to himself in splendor (27)




- Paul's point is that Jesus, in a sense, submitted himself to the church so that the church would be pure and glorious
 - · Jesus' submission was not about "authority" but about "purpose".
 - And Jesus suffered for us, he died to accomplish this purpose.




• The godly husband will treat his wife with a great purpose just like Jesus did, and this requires that he understands exactly what he is doing and honors his wife.


- This is both for her sake: honoring, glorifying
 - Love, Kindness, sacrifice, service
- · For his sake presenting her to himself
 - Heirs with you of the grace of life
 - · prayers not hindered
- $\cdot\,$ And for God's sake (13): doing good



- All of you
 - · As we consider these things, what is Peter teaching us about being subject?
 - NET: harmonious, sympathetic, affectionate, compassionate and humble
 - And we are to bless
 - To whom?
 - ESV: all of you HAVE
 - NET: all of you BE (ASV, KJV, NASB, NKJV, HCSB, YLT (being))




- Harmonious (unity of mind, one mind, likeminded)
- · Sympathetic (compassionate, fellow-feeling)
- · Affectionate (loving as brethren, brotherly)
- · Compassionate (tender hearted, pitiful, kindhearted)
- Humble (courteous, humble in spirit)
- Bless
- · not repaying, not reviling: follow example of Jesus




• In the context,


- Peter has been dealing with those might treat us poorly even if we do good.
 - Human government
 - Masters
 - Husbands
- · No matter how we are treated, this is how we are to choose to respond
 - Not easy.
- $\cdot\,$ This is how we are to choose to think of those who are oppose us.
 - Especially when enduring suffering
- 17: "honor everyone"




- $\cdot\,$ We are blessed: long life and good days
 - (but he's spoken of enduring suffering!)
 - · keep tongue from evil, speaking deceit
 - turn from evil
 - · do good
 - $\cdot\,$ seek peace and pursue it




- · God's eyes see what we are doing and he hears our prayers
 - He knows our suffering.
 - He knows our enduring.
 - He knows we're doing good.
 - He knows we seek peace.
 - $\cdot\,$ He hears our cries for deliverance, and strength, and help, and endurance.
- · He is the shepherd and overseer of our souls!




- Peter's Point:
 - $\cdot\,$ We are living in a world that knows we are disciples of Jesus
 - · And it's vital that we demonstrated the importance of being subject with a purpose.




- Why are we to be subject?
 - Peter gives us reasons throughout this that remind us of why we are to be subject in all these situations.
 - The explanation is not just ... this is the natural order of things, nor this is God's ranking of roles
 - Peter challenges us to think much more deeply.




- Why should we be subject to every human institution? "for the Lord's sake"
 - It shows that God's plan for government is correct.
 - $\cdot\,$ So we can live as free people, who are living as servants of God.



- Why should servants be subject to masters?
 - Peter says servants should be "mindful of God" when they endure suffering.
 - And it is a gracious thing.




- · Why should wives be subject to their husbands?
 - · Peter says this is how holy women "hoped in God"
 - (it's not about the husband?)
 - $\cdot\,$ Adorning that is in God's sight very precious



• Why should Husbands honor their wives?

· because they are heirs of the grace of life



- · Why should all of us be so aware of how we treat others with value even when they mistreat us?
 - 1 Peter 2:17 Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.
 - · God's eyes are on us and he hears our prayers.
 - We are striving to be like him in all things.
- Being subject is about how we think of our relationship with God, and our place before him.
 - We are his elect.
 - We choose to be subject so that God's purposes of hope and grace are clear to all.

- What does Peter mean by doing good?
 - 15: that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people.
 - 16: but living as servants of God.
 - 21: because Christ also suffered for you
 - 24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.

• 25 For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

• 1: they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives,

• 7: showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life,

• Doing good

- · starts with our attitudes towards others and how we related to them:
 - · harmonious, sympathetic, affectionate, compassionate, and humble.
 - adorning of the heart
- Honorable conduct, respect, obey, honor
- What is correct in accord with God's righteousness, fearing him
 - No sin, no deceit, didn't revile, didn't threaten
- What is kind and helpful, showing mercy
- Underlying all of this, for Peter, is greatest good we can do, share the gospel with them.
 - Whether by our words
 - $\cdot \,$ Or our conduct



- What does Peter mean by bless?
 - bless: "to speak well of" (Thayer)
 - Matthew 5:44-45 (ESV) 44 But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be sons of your Father who
 is in heaven.
 - Luke 6:27-28 (ESV) 27 "But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, 28 bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.
 - Romans 12:14 (ESV) 14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.

 $\cdot\,$ does not mean that we should say good things about those who curse us

- but rather that we should invoke God's blessing upon them
- $\cdot\,$ praying that they may be turned from their ways and follow Jesus
- Again ... like Jesus
 - forgiving
 - helping them to find salvation in Jesus
- like Jesus, we entrust our souls to the one who does judge justly.



- The World is watching us, just like it watched Jesus
 - · As sojourners and exiles
- And our behavior toward those of the world must be different than what they see and expect.
 - · Because of who our father is
 - $\cdot\,$ Because of our savior, the shepherd and overseer of our souls
- Be Subject
 - Do good, endure suffering, bless,
 - be a shining light for Jesus giving hope to all.

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

2 Corinthians 5:20

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
