


• Genesis 12



- First things we learn about Sarai is that she is barren, childless, and very beautiful
- She is 65 when the promises are made to Abram: a great nation implies they would have to have a child.
- After 11 years, 76, there's still no child and she gives Hagar her servant to Abram to have a child through her.
- · After 14 more years, 90, finally Isaac is born.





- Pursuing Righteousness
 - Isaiah 51:1-3 "Listen to me, you who pursue righteousness, you who seek the LORD: look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug. 2 Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; for he was but one when I called him, that I might bless him and multiply him. 3 For the LORD comforts Zion; he comforts all her waste places and makes her wilderness like Eden, her desert like the garden of the LORD; joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song.

· Genesis 21:6: God has made laughter for me




 \cdot The story of the promise is one that needs to be viewed over time. 25 years




• Genesis 12:2 And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing.




- Genesis 16:2 And Sarai said to Abram, "Behold now, the LORD has prevented me from bearing children. Go in to my servant; it may be that I shall obtain children by her." And Abram listened to the voice of Sarai.
- How is this hoping in God?
- It really might be true that Jehovah had prevented her.
 - Later (20:18) it explicitly states that Jehovah had done this in the house of Abimelech.
 - · Is Sarai blaming God at this point? Or is this just a statement of fact?
 - · Go with statement of fact.... (thinking the best of Sarai)




- Sarah is now 89
- Genesis 17:16 I will bless her, and moreover, I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall become nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.
 - Sarah is finally explicitly mentioned in the promise.




- · Abraham suggests Ishmael as son
 - Even Abraham is struggling with this promise and how long it's taking.
 - He'd previously suggested his servant as an heir, Eliezer.
 - Now Ishmael
- Genesis 17:19 God said, "No, but Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his offspring after him.




• Genesis 17:21 But I will establish my covenant with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this time next year."




• Genesis 18:10 The LORD said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife shall have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent door behind him.



- Genesis 21:1 The LORD visited Sarah as he had said, and the LORD did to Sarah as he had promised.
 - · 25 years since the promise was made
 - Visited (NIV = was gracious to)
 - · (NET Bible Notes Full Notes) sn
 - The Hebrew verb translated "visit" (פָקַד, paqad) often describes divine intervention for blessing or cursing;
 - it indicates God's special attention to an individual or a matter, always with respect to his people's destiny.



- · One of our common platitudes: God helps those who help themselves.
 - · God expects us to do our part
 - Philippians 2:12 Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling,



- · However, Sarah and Abraham remind us to be careful about what we mean by this.
 - · Abraham tried twice to get a substitute for the child of promise.
 - · Sarah forced her servant to become pregnant, hoping God would accept that as their child
- · When does "helping God" betray a problem with how we think about God and his keeping promises?
 - Or even questioning his faithfulness?
- · Our God is faithful.
 - · Will we be faithful to him in trusting and hoping for his promises to be fulfilled?
